*****Administrators Report**

Wood advised the Board that the invoice for the County Tax arrived Oct. 5th. The bill is due Dec. 19th. Richmond's portion of the county tax is \$343,251.00. Wood has contacted Savings Bank of Walpole for information regarding a TAN if the Board decides to go in that direction. Wood also discussed year end bills with the Board which include bond payment for the Fay Martin upgrade project, bond payment for the purchase of the "little red house" and final contributions to capital reserves/ETF as voted at Town Meeting.

Dave Kent, forester, stopped by on the 3rd to "check-in" and advise that the logging crew had had some equipment issues and have been running at "half speed" but all is resolved and will be working on completing the project in approximately 3 weeks.

*****Approve Manifest**

McWhirk moved; Jameson 2nd; the Board voted to approve the manifest dated Oct. 10, 2016 for week of Oct. 4, 2016 – Oct. 10, 2016, in the amount of: \$84,017.93 for accounts payable/payroll. This includes an invoice for road improvements in the amount of \$59,556.00.

*****Selectmen**

Selectmen executed the warrant for the election which will take place November 8, 2016.

Jameson moved; McWhirk 2nd; the Board voted to apply for payment from the following Trust Funds:

- \$18,000 from the Rescue Squad Equipment Fund
- \$11,089.99 from the Energy Retrofits for Town Bldgs. Fund
- \$2,496.75 from the Public Safety Radio Comm. Equip. Fund

- \$60,076.00 from the Road Recon. & Maint. Fund

Letter received by resident reference the Veteran's credit – read.

Adoption of revised building permit application – discussed.

Listing the “little red house” for sale was discussed. McWhirk to contact a listing agent.

Jameson moved; McWhirk 2nd; the Board voted to approve a raffle that will be held during the Harvest Festival, which will take place on Saturday, Oct. 15 from 1-4.

Jameson discussed the reconstruction of the roof of the telephone building. The Heritage Commission is requesting permission to repair/replace the roof using donations to the Heritage Commission (no tax payer dollars). Town agrees to the donation in an effort to preserve a historic site at no cost to the Town.

Public Appointments

Chief Bosquet met with the Board, reference his regularly monthly meeting with the Selectmen.

Bosquet discussed recent police activity, the Police Prosecutor, expanding his office hours to include Wednesday evenings from 4-7, upgrading computer software in the department and possible new hire.
