Meeting opened at 5:32 pm

Daniels moved; Bersaw 2nd; Board voted to approved the manifest dated May 3, 2021 for week of April 23, 2021-April 29, 2021 in the amount of: \$ 20,676.94 for payroll/accounts payable.

Daniels moved; Bersaw 2nd; Board voted to approve grinding of two stumps between the Fire Department and the Richmond Public Library. A town resident has offered to pay the fee for removal of stumps.

Board reviewed quotes for new metal roof on the old Police Department located at 15 Winchester Road. Daniels moved; Bersaw 2nd; Board voted to accept lowest quote of \$4,195 from Marvin Smart. Harrington to contact Mr. Smart.
